COURSE: PSYC 310 Topics in Psychology: Social Contrasts in Southeast Asia, 3 credits. This academic travel course offers a rare opportunity to apply classroom learning about culture, social rules, and social psychology to the thinking and behavior in practice in two very different cultures. The course will highlight how cultural history has had both similar and different effects on modern Thai and Cambodian societies, with comparisons to the United States. Students will participate in pre-travel classes as well as all planned activities and tours of unique locations in Thailand and Cambodia. **This upper-level LAS course fulfills a psychology advisement track requirement.**



ELIGIBILITY: SUNY students in good academic standing

PREREQUISITE: PSYC 111 General Psychology or permission of instructor

HIGHLIGHTS may include:

- Tours of UNESCO World Heritage Angkor Wat and Doi Suthep temples
- Service learning project and nongovernment organization (NGO) site visits
- Lectures at Pannasastra and Chiang Mai universities
- Tours of the S21 Prison and Killing Fields
- Thai and Cambodian cultural shows
- Discussions with university students and Buddhist monks
- Boat ride and Floating Village visit on the Tonle Sap Lake
- Excursions in Thailand to a farm cooking school and rescued elephant camp (feed, ride, and bathe elephants!)

ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST: \$4,795 per participant. DOES NOT INCLUDE TUITION/INSTRUCTIONAL FEES (\$779 in-state. Out-of-state tuition additional.) Includes group airfare from NYC, hotel accommodation, most meals, program-related travel, international health insurance, program fee, travel visa, and excursions/site visits. Participants will be responsible for passport expenses and personal spending money. A passport is required. **\$500 deposit due upon acceptance.** Financial aid may apply.
