- The faculty approved a motion requiring each student (Associate and Bachelor's degree) to complete a minimum of three credits of a designated applied learning course prior to graduation
- President Terenzio endorsed the motions and SUNY was notified of this action
- The Academic Policies Committee will be presenting a motion to the Executive Committee for initial review of a policy on minors—motion expected to be presented at faculty meeting in January
- The Executive Committee met with President Terenzio and cabinet members on November 3. EXCOM asked for clarification on the need for a single-sign in to Banner due to project costs
- President Terenzio provided additional information about the importance and potential uses of the BDMS system
- The Facilities and Space Committee has been tasked to explore
 - o Additional handicapped parking
 - o The potential use of the Beaver Sprite site in Dolgeville

- \circ $\,$ The possibility of providing a simple painting rehabilitation of Home Economics to allow its use
- Explore whether the College wants to be considered a "dog friendly" campus and what that means for academic programs and the campus as a whole
- Looking at Academic Integrity Policy-a recent appeals case indicated that the policy isn't clear in certain areas
- Presiding Officer Elect, Barbara Brabetz, has been shadowing the current Presiding Officer, Angelika Hoeher, to ensure a smooth transition
