COURSE: PHIL/BIOL 305 Ethics in Science, Medicine, and Technology in India, 3 credits. This academic travel course offers a rare opportunity to combine applied ethics with service, experiential learning, and exploration of environmental, medical, and socio-political institutions in India. Emphasis on the similarities and differences between Indian and American cultural will be stressed. Students will be expected to participate in pre-travel classes as well as all planned activities and tours of unique Indian locations. **Fulfills an upper level LAS elective and Gen Ed requirement.**

ELIGIBILITY: Open to SUNY students in good academic standing. PREREQUISITE: Any science or philosophy course.




- Taj Mahal visit and lecture

ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST: \$2,975 per participant. DOES NOT INCLUDE TUITION/FEES (add \$743 in-state). Includes group airfare from NYC, hotel accommodation, meals, program-related travel, international health insurance, program fee, travel visa, and excursions/site visits. Participants will be responsible for passport expenses, vaccinations, and personal spending money. Passports are required. **\$350 deposit due upon acceptance.** Financial aid may apply.
