Dec 29, 2016- Jan 12, 2017, 2 Credits Trip Highlights Include:


An ecological trek across the isthmus: Visit the Cloud Forest of El Valle including night hikes, Hiking in Sarigua National Park, Volcan Baru, and the rainforests of Gamboa. Enjoy a boat ride to Coiba National Park for whale watching and snorkeling, and observe the breeding grounds of threatened sea birds.
