Each residence hall or complex has a Hall Council which provides leadership and programming for the building. The Hall Council has a budget to work with and the members will vote on how to use this funding. Residence Hall Break Closing

Our halls close during breaks and students need to leave the building during these times. The campus has a limited number of beds for break housing which would require a student, in most cases, to relocate to another room during the break. An extra charge applies if you stay during a break. You will need to sign up in the Residential Life Office two weeks prior to the break if you need housing.



Please take note of the following times that the Residence halls are closed:

Fall Break halls close at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, October 11. Residence halls will reopen at 12:00 noon on Tuesday, October 14. Thanksgiving Break halls close at 10:00a.m. on Wednesday, November 26. Residence halls will reopen at 12:00 noon on Sunday, November 30.

#### **End of Semester Closing**

Semester closing will take place at 10:00 a.m. on December 13. However, students must depart the residence hall 24 hours after their last class or final exam, whichever is later.

The residence halls will reopen for continuing students on Sunday, January 18, 2015.
